
Semicolons and Colons

A **semicolon** is sometimes used in place of a period or in place of a comma and a conjunction. A semicolon signals that the ideas in the two independent clauses are similar in thought or in style. (*He came; he conquered.*)

A **colon,** on the other hand, mainly calls the readers' attention to what comes after the colon, whether it be a list or a key word. (For more information, see pages 594 and 596 in *Write Source*.)



Examples

Semicolons Join Independent Clauses:

My brother listens to punk rock; I listen to country music.

(Instead of a comma and a conjunction, a semicolon joins the two independent clauses.)

Semicolons Join Independent Clauses Connected by a Conjunctive Adverb: Margarita listens to the Beatles; however, she also likes jazz music. (A semicolon joins the two independent clauses with the conjunctive adverb "however.")

Colons Introduce a List:

Motown Records has recorded many great artists: Stevie Wonder, Diana Ross, Smokie Robinson, the Temptations, and the Four Tops.

Colons Separate a Word for Emphasis:

Most record companies are motivated by the same thing: money.
